<i>Obligatory:</i>	<p><b>Must not donate if:</b></p> <p>a) Malignant.</p> <p>b) Clonal disorder such as primary polycythaemia (rubra vera) or essential thrombocythaemia. <del>or monoclonal gammopathy of unknown significance (MGUS).</del></p>
<i>Discretionary:</i>	<p>a) If polycythaemia or thrombocytosis is secondary to a non-malignant/clonal condition, accept.</p> <p>b) Monoclonal gammopathy of unknown significance (MGUS) – see 'Malignancy' entry.</p>
<i>See if Relevant:</i>	<p><u>Anaemia</u> <u>Haemoglobin Disorders</u> <u>Immune Thrombocytopenia</u> <u>Malignancy</u> <u>Therapeutic Venesection</u></p>
